Science stream has been introduced from the session 2025-2026. The admission process for both levels is currently underway.



COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

The college authority has laid down the following rules which are essential for the healthy academic life of an institution.

1. It is mandatory for all the students to come to college wearing prescribed uniform. No student can attend class without uniform.
2. Students must come to college with their college identity. Any loss or damage of the card must be brought to the knowledge of the college authority.
3. A student must have 75% of class attendance otherwise she/he will not be allowed to appear in sessional examinations. If any student is found absent at least for 15 days at a stretch then he/she will be considered discollegiate.
4. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken against those involved in such anti-academic activities.
5. Unlawful use of mobile phones inside college campus will result in disciplinary action.
6. Writing or sticking any bills on the college walls and rooms will result in disciplinary action. Any notice to be pasted elsewhere in the college compound needs prior approval of the college authority.
7. Any discourtesy shown to the teachers and office staff will be dealt with strict hands.
8. Students must refrain from indulging in any unfair means in the examination hall.
9. Students must clear their dues on time.
10. Smoking and consumption of liquor or any intoxicants leads to serious disciplinary action.
11. Students should park their bicycles or two-wheeler nowhere except for students' parking lot.
12. The Principal is the final authority for maintaining internal and external discipline of the college and taking any final decision.
13. Selection test for offering Major course will be held after ten days from the commencement of classes.
14. Guardians' presence in the guardian meeting is highly solicited for necessary feedback and valuable suggestions.

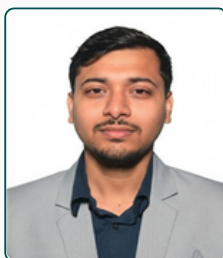

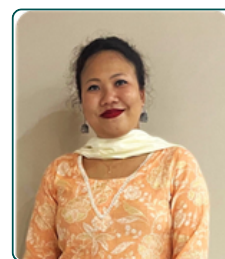

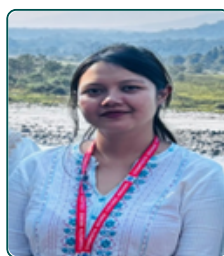

- **Theory Classes:**
1 Credit = 15 Classes in one semester = 15 Contact hours in one semester.
- **Tutorial Classes:**
1 Credit = 15 Tutorial classes in one semester = 15 Contact hours in one semester.
- **Practical Classes:**
1 Credit (2h) = 30 Contact hours in one semester.

NOTE:

- Students willing to pursue UG Degree with Minors shall have to choose two disciplines (MIN-A and MIN-B) in the first semester and may opt to pursue MIN-A as a Major discipline in the 7th Semester if he/she secures 75 percent marks till 6th Semester with no backlog or betterment.
- Students willing to pursue 7 years UG Degree with a Major and Minor shall have to choose one Major (MAJ) and one Minor (MIN) in the first semester.
- Students must choose IDC from the pool of courses not studied at the 10+2 level.
- **SEC-** Students can choose own discipline/other discipline.
- **VAC-** 19 Course (But the College/Institute may offer 3-4 courses from the list provided).

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

- **End-Semester Examinations:** The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangement for notifying the dates of the End-Semester Examinations as per the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- **Continuous Formative Evaluation/Internal Assessment (IA):** Total marks for each course shall be based on continuous assessments and semester end examination.
 - Total marks for each course = 100 and 50 Marks
 - For 50 marks = No Internal Assessment
 - Continuous/Internal assessment = 30 Marks
 - Semester End Examination = 70 Marks/50 + 20 Marks (Practical)
 - Continuous/Internal Assessment = 30 Marks
 - Sessional Test = 10 Marks
 - Class Attendance = 5 Marks

Assignment, etc. = 15 Marks



5% marks for attendance shall be awarded as follows:

- Course under Value Added, Community outreach activities etc., shall be of 04 Credits. The 04 Credits value-added courses may be split into two parts. For example, 02 credit for Env. Sc/ Env. Ed/Digital and Technology solution and 02 credits for Yoga/Sports/NSS/Community engagement etc. which equals 4 credit in the category in a semester.
- 4th semester Internship/Apprenticeship shall be of 02 credits.
- Summer Internship/Apprenticeship shall be of 04 credits of minimum 8 weeks duration and shall be mandatory for students who decide to exit with UG Certificate/UG Diploma.
- Final year Research project/Dissertation to be of 12 credits.
- Students shall choose one MOOC course from the list of courses offered for SEC, VAC or IDC in single semester.

ASSIGNMENT

For instance, in a Minor Paper (Political Science), with a total of 240 students (12 groups of 20 students each), a common set of questions may be assigned to each group, and students will submit their assignments individually.

GUIDELINES FOR INTERNSHIP

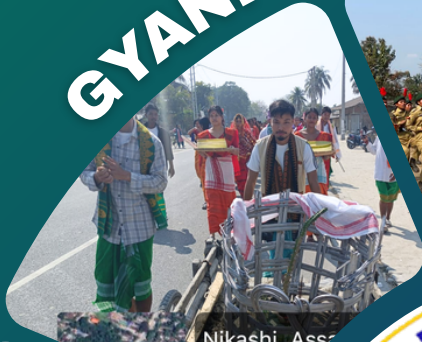
- Report to be prepared after completion of Internship. Report is to be signed by Supervisor.

- Authenticated internship report by the Head of the institution will be sent to CoE.
- On successful completion of internship only, students will be issued certificate from the University.
